New England Revolution Team up with Animal Rescue League of Boston to Support Adoption Efforts and Collect Food

Revolution players to visit ARL Boston for tour and volunteer day on Tuesday, June 4
ARL Boston will have animals available for adoption in the Fan Zone at the next Revolution home
match on June 8 against New York Red Bulls

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. – Next week, the New England Revolution and its players are joining forces with the Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) to support their pet adoption efforts and collect much-needed food supplies for the organization's <u>Keep Pets S.A.F.E.</u> community program.

On <u>Tuesday, June 4 at 2:30 p.m. ET</u>, Revolution players Emmanuel Boateng, Brandon Bye, Mark-Anthony Kaye, and Andrew Farrell will visit the Animal Rescue League's Dedham branch. The professional soccer players will take a tour of the facility with the ARL staff, meet the animals up for adoption, and help with a volunteer project on-site. Farrell, the 2023 Revolution Humanitarian of the Year, participated in last year's event as well as the ARL's "<u>Too Hot for Spot</u>" campaign in each of the last two years, promoting summer pet safety.

On <u>Saturday, June 8</u> before the Revolution's 7:30 p.m. ET Major League Soccer home match against the New York Red Bulls, Revolution players will arrive to Gillette Stadium wearing shirts with photos of dogs and cats currently available for adoption with the Animal Rescue League. Those shirts will then be signed and donated to ARL for auction. Prior to the match, fans will have the unique opportunity to interact with and adopt animals from ARL Boston in the Revolution Fan Zone, located in the Enel Plaza outside Gillette Stadium. Fans can also scan QR codes located on the concourse to support ARL with monetary donations.
