## **ARL Takes in Trio of Dogs from Bahamas Rescue Facing Eviction**

Dogs ready to begin next chapter

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) has taken in a trio of mixed-breed dogs from a canine refuge in the Bahamas that is scrambling to find placement for dozens of dogs after receiving an eviction notice.

The dogs range from 9-months-old to 3-years-old, are all female mixed-breed dogs and have all faced unique challenges in their short lives. From being found in a torrential rain storm and almost dying of parvo, to waiting years for a new home, these animals have persevered, and ARL is thrilled for the opportunity to help these dogs find the homes and lives they deserve.

The dogs are friendly but extremely fearful as they are still adjusting to their new surroundings, and ARL believes the animals would do best with another canine companion in the home.

Like many island communities in the Caribbean, the Bahamas is overwhelmed by the number of stray and homeless animals living on the streets. Over the past four years, Pawtcake Refuge has rescued more than 5,000 dogs in Nassau, however, the refuge is now facing eviction and has partnered with animal welfare groups throughout the United States to help find new homes for dozens of these animals. ARL is the only animal welfare group in Massachusetts to receive dogs from Pawtcake Refuge.

While ARL's primary focus is on helping animals in our local communities in need, the organization's vast community-based services has kept shelter populations low, allowing ARL to assist other animal welfare organizations facing overcrowding or the unique circumstances Pawtcake Refuge is facing.
