## Severely Burned Cat Finishes Treatment, Finds New Home

Cat suffered second/third-degree burns covering more than 50 percent of body

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) is thrilled to announce that a one-year-old female cat who suffered severe burns and has been in the care of the organization since November 2023, has finished her course of treatment and has also found her forever home.

The cat, now named Era, was found in a work shed in Oxford, MA, in November 2023, and once the extent of her injuries was realized, Oxford Animal Control contacted ARL for assistance and the cat was transported to ARL's Boston Animal Care and Adoption Center for treatment.

ARL's veterinary team assessed that second and third-degree burns were covering over half her body, and treatment has consisted of pain management and twice-weekly wound debridement to remove dead skin and exposing the new skin underneath to promote healing. Initially is was unknown whether Era would be able to overcome her injuries, however, she is incredibly resilient responded very well to treatment.

It is still unknown what caused the burns and whether it was an intentional act, but ARL's focus was saving the animal's life and preparing her for the next chapter in her life. After six painful months, Era's path to recovery is complete, and having forged an incredible bond with her foster parent during her journey, once Era was ready for adoption, she became what ARL lovingly refers to as a foster fail. She is home with her foster parent, now owner, and is thriving.

Era's cost of care over six months was approximately \$30,000 and ARL has now established a fund to help care for animals with complex medical needs. Named in her honor, Era's Fund will provide medical care for animals in need like her and give them the best chance to heal. From medication and vaccines, exams, diagnostics to surgery and special treatments, the fund will help animals like Era when they need it most.
