Hurricane Milton Dogs Ready for Adoption at ARL

Dogs part of emergency relocation effort

This past week as Hurricane Milton inched closer to the Florida mainland, the Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) coordinated with its national partners to take in 10 dogs that were removed from areas of the state that were projected to be directly impacted by the storm. ARL is pleased to announce that the majority of the dogs are now ready to find their new homes at ARL's Brewster Animal Care and Adoption Center.

Anyone interested in meeting and possibly adopting one of these pups is encouraged to log onto arlboston.org for animal profiles and more information.

ARL was honored to assist its national partners in this important operation and remains ready should more animals need to be relocated from the impacted areas of Florida.

A sudden large influx of animals presents financial challenges for ARL. To help these animals ARL must rely on the combined strength of its staff, volunteers, and the generosity of donors.
